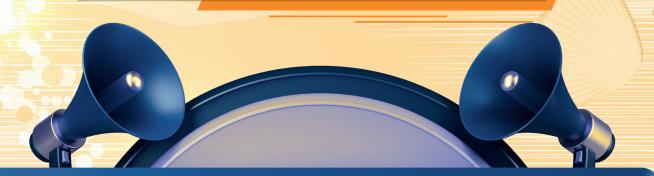

The camp provided unforgettable spirit of adventure, newfound confidence and lasting memories.

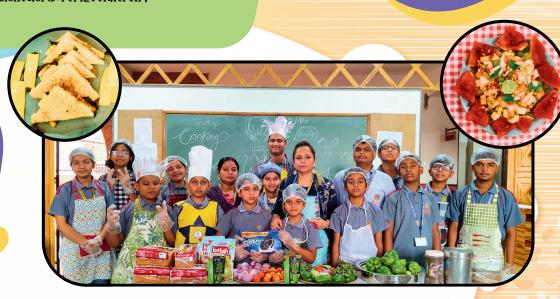
